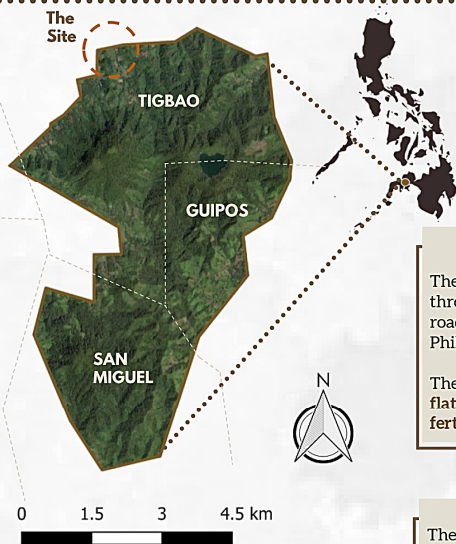


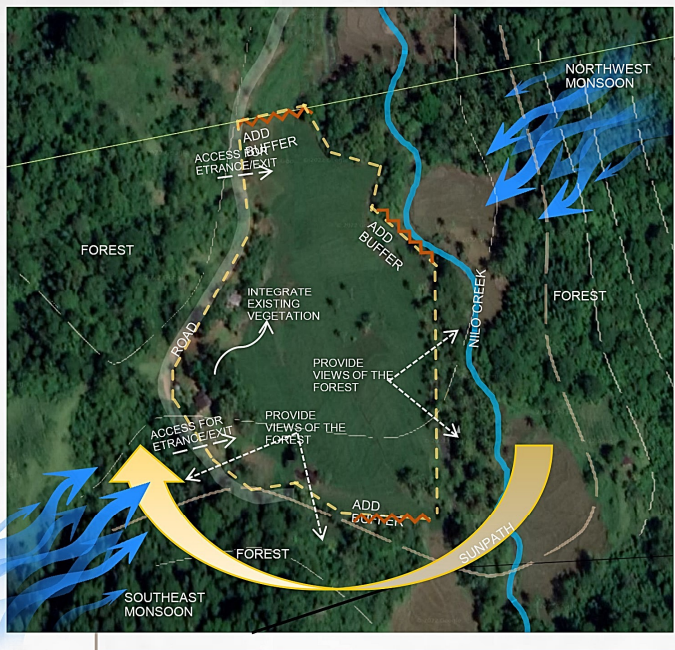
HILAMDAGAN

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A Proposed Botanical Park & Arboretum in Mt. Timolan Protected Landscape



S	<p>The site is accessible through a 6-meter road connected to Pan-Philippine Highway.</p> <p>The site is relatively flat and has high fertility soil.</p>
W	<p>The site does not have defined boundaries.</p>
O	<p>The site is an open space and classified under expansion area.</p> <p>The site is surrounded by remnants of dipterocarp forest which has high biodiversity.</p>
T	<p>The site is located at the foot of Mt. Timolan peak which is moderately susceptible from rain-induced landslide.</p>

DESIGN PHILOSOPHY

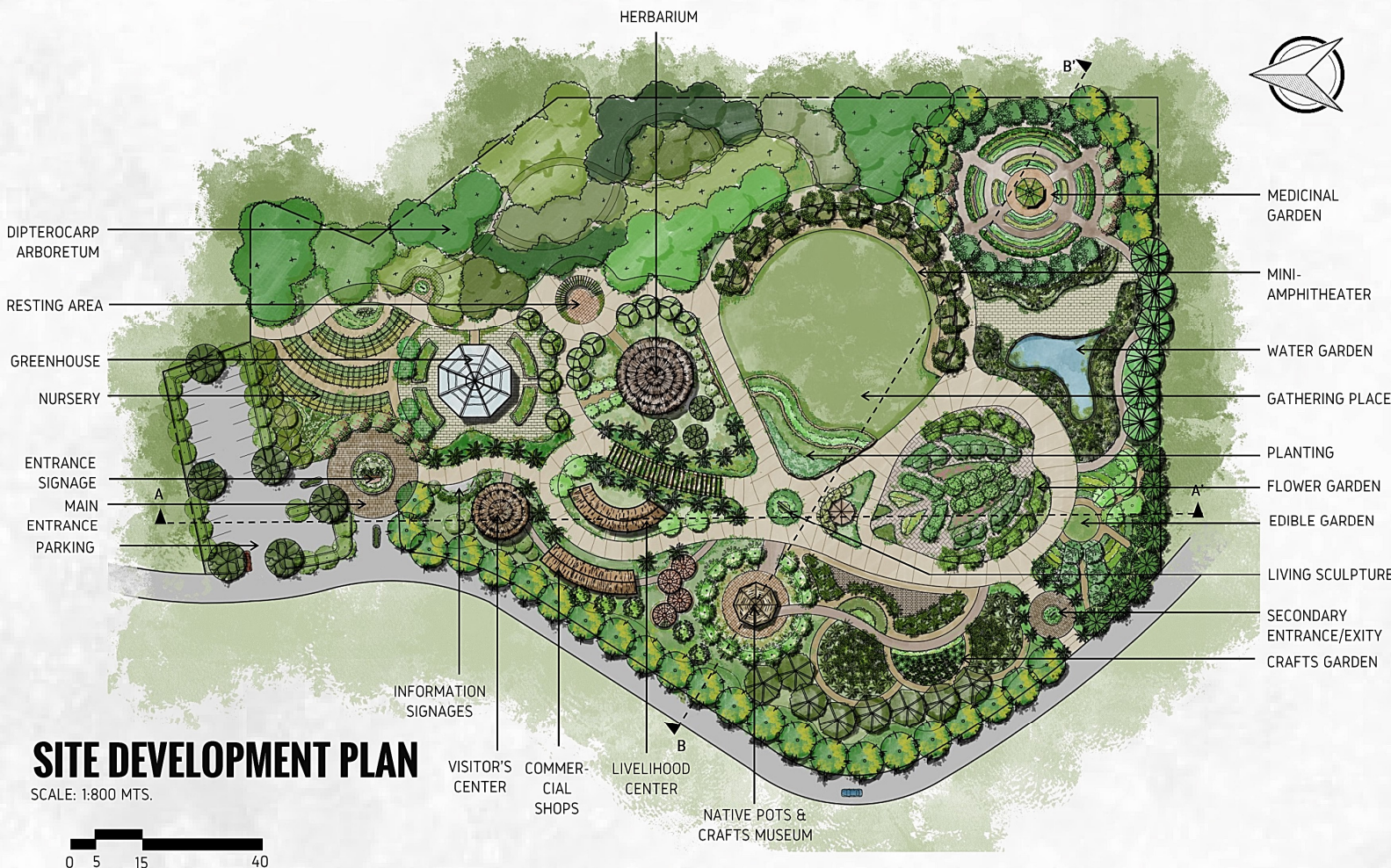
Symbolic Interaction Theory

VISION

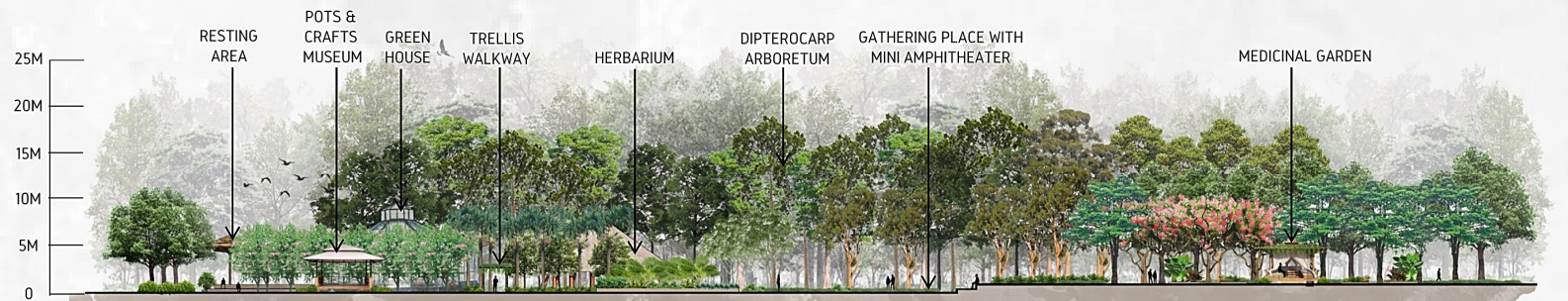
A botanical park that features culturally-useful plant species to Subanen people of MTPL, as a source of revitalization and preservation of their ethnobotanical knowledge

SCALE: 1:750 MTS.

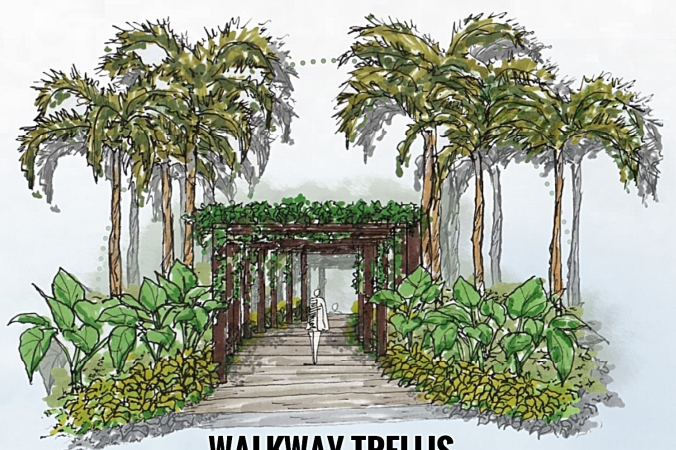


SECTION ELEVATION B-B'
